York, PA --- Ronald Redding's newest collection of wallcoverings and fabrics, Indigo Sea, is a true departure from his previous collections – a departure in style and in color. It is almost as if Redding has allowed a fresh, contemporary breeze waft through his interpretation of tropical design. He has taken the 21st century's global view of all things tropical, added Asian accents and mixed them with British Colonial Caribbean and other European influences.

The drama of lushly colored tropical florals is balanced by the effortless sophistication of pale white blossoms. Palm fronds, banana leaves and bamboo join natural weaves and materials to offer a sensuous variety of designs and textures. Oriental accents of Chinese porcelain vases and Asian toiles propose more simplified color stories. Tonal and multi-colored stripes along with trellises, large and small, are effective coordinates.

All are rendered in colors and color combinations new to Ronald Redding. Reacting to the trend of blending the indoors and outdoors, Redding has colored these designs as if he has captured them in the bright sunlight of a perfect day – perhaps in early morning before the sun has had the opportunity to dry the moisture accumulated over the evening. All is alive and robust. The greens of the leaves are dark and rich, the pinks, yellows and golds of blossoms are pure and true, and the backgrounds reflect the bright sun in its purest form.

Redding has captured the clarity and energy of nature at that moment in wallcoverings and fabric – wallcoverings and fabric which allow us to recreate that moment – throughout our homes – throughout the day!
